## Who is Zerubbabel & Why We Celebrate Zerubbabel Day as Holy Royal Arch Masons?

You may be familiar with story of Emperor Darius and his three bodyguards. The story goes that the three would name to Darius the one thing that is the strongest in the world, he would choose the wisest answers, and grant them great gifts and the title of “Relative of the Emperor”. The first answered “there is nothing stronger than wine”. The second answered “there is nothing stronger than the emperor”. The third, Zerubbabel answered “there is nothing stronger than woman, yet truth can conquer anything”. When Zerubbabel had finished speaking, all the people shouted, “Truth is great – there is nothing stronger!” Then the emperor said to him, “You may ask anything you want, even more than what was agreed, and I will give it to you. You will be my adviser, and you will be granted the title “Relative of the Emperor.” Zerubbabel replied, “Your Majesty, permit me to remind you of the solemn vow you took on the day you became emperor. You promised to rebuild Jerusalem and to send back all the treasures that had been taken from the city. Remember that when Cyrus made a vow to destroy Babylon, he set these things aside and solemnly promised to send them back to Jerusalem. You also promised to rebuild the Temple, which the Edomites burned down when the Babylonians devastated the land of Judah. So, Your Majesty, because you are a man of generosity, I beg you to fulfill the solemn promise you made to the King of heaven.” Then Emperor Darius stood up, kissed Zerubbabel, and wrote letters for him to all the treasurers, governors, and administrators in the provinces, ordering them to provide safe passage for him and all those going with him to rebuild Jerusalem.

After a season of about fourteen months to get settled, the Jewish people began to rebuild in earnest. It wasn’t long before opposition arose from surrounding adversaries, and, eventually, the work was brought to a standstill by order of King Artaxerxes (Ezra 4:1–24). Only the foundation of the temple had been completed. After a seventeen-year delay the Jews were granted permission to continue rebuilding. Within three and a half years after the second effort began, the temple was completed in 516 BC. Although Zerubbabel’s temple was smaller than Solomon’s had been, God promised a greater glory: “The glory of this present house will be greater than the glory of the former house,” said the Lord. The glory bestowed on Zerubbabel’s temple came centuries later when Jesus Christ came into the temple courts. Solomon’s temple never received a visit from Jesus, but Zerubbabel’s did. While the temple Zerubbabel helped rebuild paled in comparison to the size and grandeur of Solomon’s, it far outlasted it.

So why do we celebrate Zerubbabel Day as York Rite Masons? We as York Rite Masons celebrate Zerubbabel Day during the time in which it is believed that Zerubbabel began to build the second Temple. This is said to be the second month of the Hebrew calendar during the month of Iyar. We are reminded of the great efforts of Zerubbabel in freeing his people and restoring their land to rebuild the Temple of God. We look into his character and his works as we continue to work on ourselves. Just as Zerubbabel freed the Jews who were held in captivity, we are reminded to free our minds from the vices that hold us captive. Allowing our minds to freely build upon itself to contemplate and appreciate the blessings of our Creator. Allowing our spirits to move freely to perform the glorious work so that we may honor our Creator.

As Zerubbabel worked with such zeal to rebuild the Temple of God, we are reminded to be ever so zealous in the rebuilding of our spiritual temple, that temple which we have been erecting within ourselves – to the services of the Supreme Being. And although we know of a certainty that all earthly things are transient, and that in process of time, even at the best, decay of ages will crumble our magnificent temple into dust, yet we are persuaded, that, if we have erected the temple of our inner life through the teachings of His Word, its foundations shall never fail, and its fabric shall never crumble nor decay. So let us take care that we so labor in the erection of our temple here, that when we leave this earthly platform, for that mansion in the sky, we will hear him say “well done, my good and faithful servant”.
